## COMMON REASONS FOR NONADHERENCE IN ELDERLY PATIENTS

Reason for Nonadherence	Comment
Patients' assessment of the risk and benefit	Patients may perceive the treatment benefit to be small compared with its cost.
Potential side effects	Elderly patients frequently worry about or experience sedation, constipation, sexual problems, or other adverse events.
Cost	Treatment costs and prescriptions can be burdensome for uninsured or marginally insured individuals. In a survey of 875 older adults, 19% said they had cut back on their medication use in the past year because of cost. <sup>9</sup> In the US, 2 million elderly Medicare beneficiaries do not adhere to medicines, citing cost as the reason. <sup>10</sup>
Regimen complexity	Patients prefer simple, easily remembered medication regimens; once-daily, transdermal, or other convenient dosing formulations enhance adherence with chronic drug therapy.
Fear of addiction	Many patients avoid pain medication or reduce the dose, believing that all pain medications are addictive. In a survey of 324 patients, more than one third believed that prescribed analgesics had dependence risks or unwanted long-term effects. Those with the strongest belief were the least adherent. <sup>11</sup>
Cognitive decline	Lack of understanding increases risk of nonadherence.
